

Our last event of the season was held at Sardinia Ristorante in Boca Raton. Attendees were treated to an extensive Sardinian tasting dinner, including Sardinian wine. Music was provided by Gianni Monti. *Felice estate a tutti.* See you in the Fall.

Festa della Donna, also widely known as International Women's Day, gained momentum after a 1911 factory fire in New York where 146 women, mostly immigrants, perished. More than 100,000 outraged people participated in the funeral march and it subsequently became a global event as an expression of unity and promotion of equal rights around the world.

Its popularity rose in Italy in 1946, on the first March 8th following the end of WW II, when Italian feminists chose the mimosa flower as a symbol of sensitivity, strength and sensibility.

On March 8th at the classic Arturo's Ristorante in Boca Raton, we honored two accomplished women, both of whom have made significant contributions to the promotion of Italian culture through their life's work.

Barbara Salani, renowned concert pianist, music teacher, author of "Music for Life: the Salani Brothers" (soon to be a movie).

Rosaria Gismondi, proprietor of Arturo's Ristorante, former president of Unico, a real estate agent, and mother of 5 daughters.

Many attendees brought a small piece of embroidered cloth that represented a woman or worker in their lives. These cloths were gathered and sent to New York to be part of a memorial for the Triangle Shirtwaist Factory fire of March 25, 1911.

This was a first-time event for Il Circolo and was chaired by Professor Ilaria Serra of Florida Atlantic University and Claire Giannamore, Il Circolo board member. We hope to make it annual on our event calendar.



Appreciation Lunch Il Circolo held its annual end-of-season Appreciation Lunch for board members, staff, volunteers and supporters, at the classic fine-dining La Sirena restaurant in West Palm Beach.

The event started with a warm greeting by President Paul Finizio who introduced and generously acknowledged the contributions of many in the room, each of whom was responsible in some way for making the current season a notable success.

Under the supervision of proprietor Marcello Fiorentino, guests enjoyed a celebratory and exquisite multi-course luncheon while small groups chatted and enjoyed each other's company.



With this issue of La Circolettera, we put the spotlight on Ken Langone, a well-known, extremely successful and admired Italian-American, who recently made the news again when he and his wife Elaine shocked the audience of NYU first year medical students and their families at the traditional White Coat ceremony by announcing "As of this very moment, the NYU school of medicine is now a tuition-free medical school."

According to Langone, NYU's free tuition applies not just to first-year med students, but to every current student in every class. It's a gift worth more than \$200,000 each, erases the stress of student loans and frees them to focus on their chosen profession. It took more than a decade to put this plan in action, but NYU now has the endowment to offer free tuition to every med student, in perpetuity. And the implication for the future of medicine in this country has been taken to a new level.

We also want to share with you a bit of the correspondence between our Sally Valenti who immediately sent an email congratulating Langone on this magnanimous initiative and his response to her that speaks to what the Italian family and Il Circolo is all about.

Sally: *After seeing you on 60 Minutes, I realized how privileged I am to have this photo with you. As a member of the Italian American community, we share its root values and worship the privileges our immigrant parents took advantage of to make a better life ... Despite all kinds of adversities, they were the parents of the first 2 Italian brothers to graduate from West Point, one in 1943, the other in 1947 ... I'm so proud of what my parents accomplished and so proud of how you share your hard-work achieved success with aspiring young men and women who aim to benefit society.*

Langone: *You speak so eloquently about our heritage and the efforts our ancestors made so that we could have better lives and have the chance to live the American dream. That has happened and now we live in this great experiment called America. Elaine and I are committed to showing our gratitude by sharing the many blessings that have come our way. I hope things are well and I again thank you for your kind words. How blessed we are to have great Americans like your brothers who gave so much to make sure all our freedoms are protected.*

Ken Langone made his fortune as a co-founder of Home Depot. He and Elaine donated \$100 million toward the free tuition initiative, and he helped raise the additional \$350 million needed to make it a reality.
